Part-time evening students who have completed two semesters of law school may register for Business Associations, Land Use, and Legal Ethics.

ANY STUDENT WHOSE CUMULATIVE GRADE POINT AVERAGE AFTER SPRING 2010 IS BELOW 2.0 AND WHO IS ENROLLED IN A SUMMER COURSE WILL BE ADMINISTRATIVELY WITHDRAWN FROM THE COURSE. Even if a petition for reinstatement is granted, summer course work will not be recognized. Any student so withdrawn from courses will be entitled to a full credit of summer tuition.

NOTE: Full-time students may register for a maximum of 3 courses (9 hours) during the summer session; part-time students may register for a maximum of 2 courses (7 hours) during the summer session. Students registering for more than two courses are prohibited from working more than 20 hours per week during the summer session.

Advanced Research and Writing Sections – Summer 2010

Each Fall and Spring semester every faculty member who is not on leave will offer a section of Advanced Research and Writing. Listed below are the topics on which certain faculty members are prepared to supervise student papers for Summer 2010.

Ordinarily, if there is a substantive course offered in the subject area in which you wish to write a paper for Advanced Research and Writing, you must 1) have completed that course, **or** 2) be concurrently enrolled in that course, **or** 3) receive the prior permission of the instructor. Some instructors may require completion of that course and not just concurrent enrollment. To determine the requirements for a particular section, or to clarify its topics, you should contact the instructor before registering.

Each section will have a limited enrollment, and once that limit is reached that section will be closed. If your first choice for a section is closed, enrolling for Advanced Research and Writing in Summer 2009 would require selecting another section. If you wish to work only with a particular professor or professors and their sections are closed or not offered this Summer you will have to wait for a later semester. Registration takes place online through the ordinary registration process.
